

**Combined Synopsis/Solicitation

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial service prepared in accordance with the format in FAR Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; quotes are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued. The solicitation number is W911RZ-23-Q-0006. This solicitation document and incorporated provisions and clauses are those in effect through Federal Acquisition Circular (FAC) 2022-08 dated 10-28-22 and DFARS Defense Publication Notice Current to DPN 20220929.

Fort Carson intends to award a Firm Fixed Price contract to provide 1 x 80K Crane rental that will give the 2SBCT, 4ID the lifting capability to move oversized equipment as part of a Joint Readiness Training Center training event in Fort Polk, LA.
